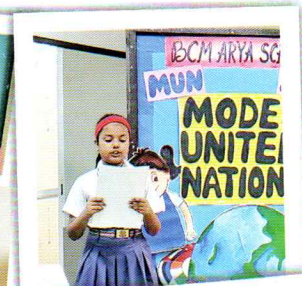


TED Ed

Instructions :

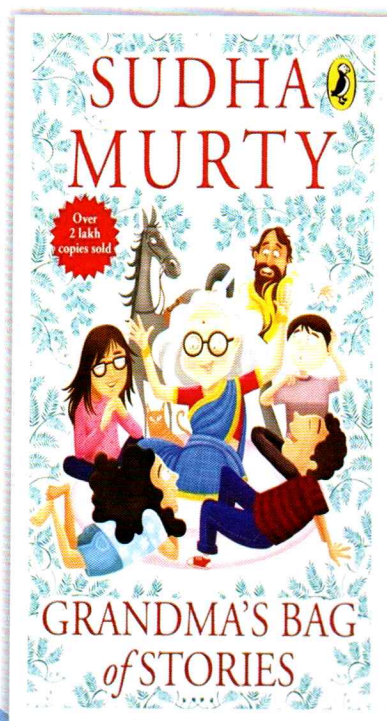
1. Boil pasta with oil & 1 tsp of sugar.

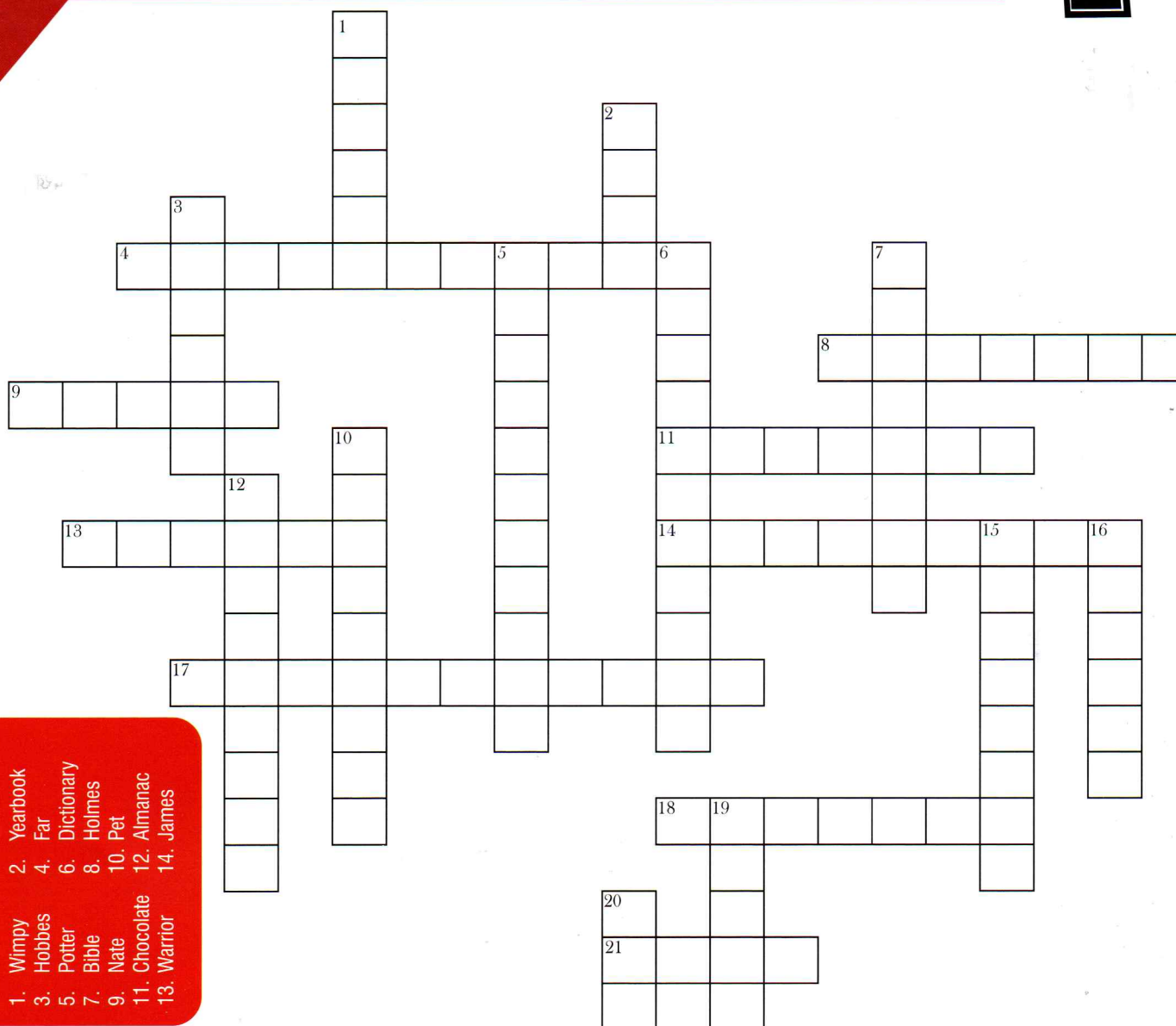

Basant Panchami

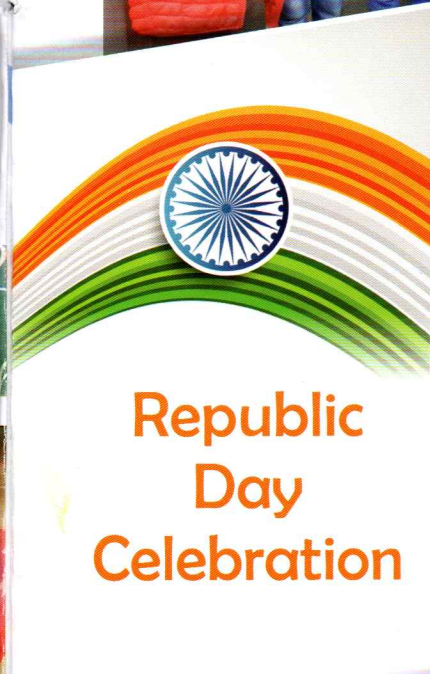
